





Saltaire Stroll

Itinerary Essentials

Arrive in Saltaire by train; the station is right in the centre of the village, from where it's easy to start exploring everything this UNESCO World Heritage site has to offer.


Laid out in a grid, it's easy to find your way around. Pick up the relaxed vibe and take your time to get to know this historic gem on the edge of the city.

Top picks for your visit:

- Salts Mill has been transformed into a haven for art, culture, and leisure. With so many spaces to explore, you'll find something different every time you visit.
- The Peace Museum has recently relocated to Saltaire creating a unique and thought provoking space.
- Take a walk up Victoria Road to Bingley Road to find more independent retailers, cafés and bars to take you from daytime to evening.

Keep exploring:

- Hop on the Shipley Glen Tramway for a gentle ride up the hill to explore Shipley Glen, which then connects to routes across Baildon Moor and beyond.
- Relax in the serene surroundings of the Leeds Liverpool Canal with a walk to Hirst Wood Lock
- Enjoy a curry at the Aagrah in Shipley, established in the town in 1977, it's one of several great eateries you'll find locally.



Saltaire Village Heritage Trail





The Trail begins on the bridge over the railway line, offering views down Victoria Road towards the countryside. Sir Titus Salt envisioned relocating his business to a greenfield site to escape Bradford's overcrowded, unhealthy conditions. Architects Lockwood & Mawson designed the village grid layout, creating space for Salt's factory.



03 Roberts Park

Continue downhill along Victoria Road, passing the Saltaire United Reformed Church to the canal bridge. Despite its rural location, Saltaire was well-connected by the railway, Leeds and Liverpool Canal, and local roads. Turn left to cross the River Aire via the footbridge. Salt planned Roberts Park (1871) to promote workers' health.

05 Salts Mill

Retrace your steps to the Railway Bridge, where the mill chimney is visible. Salt positioned the mill to ensure westerly winds would blow smoke away from the village. The mill is separated from housing by allotments where workers grew food. This zoning approach became a model for other company towns.





Saltaire Village

Walk down the cobbled Albert Terrace, then left onto William Henry Street, where three-storey houses were for workers and larger homes for foremen. Turn right onto Caroline Street, where lower-paid employees' houses open onto the street.

10 Victoria Hall

At the Albert Road junction, turn left uphill, passing the 'overlookers' and executive homes. Cross Saltaire Road at the zebra crossing, walk along Bingley Road, turn left onto Victoria Road, passing the Almshouses, School, and Institute (now Victoria Hall), finishing at the railway bridge.

05 Salts Mill and 1853 Gallery

Salts Mill, a 19th-century textile mill, features shops, galleries, dining, and an extensive David Hockney collection.

05 The Peace Museum

Britain's oldest working cable tramway offers a scenic ride through woodland, complete with a museum and a traditional sweet shop, adding to the charm of this historic experience.

02 Saltaire United Reformed Church

The Grade-I listed United Reformed Church, completed in 1859, is an impressive example of Italianate architecture with Sir Titus Salt's family mausoleum.

Saltaire is easily accessible by train from Bradford Forster Square and buses (routes 662, 622, 626) from Bradford, Shipley, and Keighley. Parking is available at Exhibition Road, Caroline Street, and Salts Mill (via Shipley, postcode BD17 7EF). There is a Clean Air Zone in Bradford, with no charges for passenger cars.
